




The Comox Valley Early Years Collaborative is a network of over 50 individuals and organizations committed to improving the lives of the children in the Comox Valley.





Comox Valley EDI Data


Wave 6 (2013-2016)



Putting data into action

A commissioned report suggested using a *Social Innovation Lab* approach to create place-based solutions for local families, starting in the areas with greatest EDI vulnerability.

Throughout the resulting project, we considered the **systems and nested environments** that influence and support the development of children.



Social Innovation Labs



Social Innovation labs are used to tackle complex challenges that have proved difficult to solve and where no simple solution is available.




The process includes diverse stakeholders, especially those who are most impacted by the challenge.



Social Innovation Labs are experimental. Innovative interventions are trialed and reviewed.



Utilize a systems thinking approach.

PROJECT PRINCIPLES


- Children thrive in healthy environments.
- Children's development is complex. It is impacted by individual, family, community and broader societal factors.
- Parents know what is best for their children.
- Parents do the best they can for their children within their context and circumstances.
- Parents and community residents are the most effective leaders in local change.


North Comox Valley: Innovation Workshop 2 – Designing Innovations

North Comox Valley: Innovations planned and developed Project Expansion: Virtual focus groups, focus on connecting with parents in South Comox Building Connections started in 2019 in the North Comox Valley, and continued through the other 3 EDI neighbourhoods in order of EDI vulnerability: South Comox Valley, Courtenay & Comox.

Phase 1: Data Gathering & Community Engagement


Data Gathering & Community Engagement

In each EDI neighbourhood we gathered data from parents & community members through surveys & focus groups about families' experiences raising children in their communities.

We heard from over **300 parents** through our online surveys.

We connected with over **120 parents** at focus groups and community events.








Phase 2: Data Analysis & Plan Development

Data Analysis & Plan Development

In each EDI neighbourhood we organized data into data maps, which showed us the system that currently supports local children, and a vision of a **future**, **better system** for each neighbourhood.

We hosted innovation planning workshops using these maps to guide our planning.

We connected with over **65 community** stakeholders, service providers, and parents at our innovation workshops.



INNOVATIONS OFFER CONNECTION POINTS


Primary reason that motivates parents/caregivers to attend is *relational*

1. Create community drop-in programs within the North Comox Valley

- Allows families to meet their neighbors for easier connections outside program times
- Programs are as low barrier as possible
- Gives families a space to gather informally







- Acts as a listening ear to parenting challenges
- Provides a link between family services & resources, and refers if necessary

INNOVATIONS OFFER CONNECTION POINTS



1. Create a

Cumberland Early

Years Collaborative

- Priority #1: To gather a variety of Cumberland community members together for connection & information sharing
- Priority #2: To establish a shared commitment to supporting early years families in Cumberland



2. Create a South Comox Valley Family Connector role

- Looks for further ways to connect families in Royston, Union Bay, Fanny Bay
- Focuses on relationship building within & among families in the community
- Aims to build partnerships with local service organizations and community boards
- Organizes drop-in events with partner organizations (including Healthy Families Program) for South Comox Valley families
